### Volunteer Opportunities:

**~Recycling Team:** The St. Dominic newspaper recycling team is in need of a volunteer to straighten the paper trailer. After many years of diligent service, Tom Begley is retiring from this position. This job requires that the volunteer make two trips to the trailer during each month to move newspapers to the rear, remove newspapers from plastic bags (All-Weather Insulation will not accept newspaper in plastic) and do general stacking and straightening in the trailer. Usually, it is a good idea to do this soon after each pick-up, which is the second Monday of every month (except July). Since many people take their newspapers to the trailer directly, it is a good idea to go one more time during the month. These visits can be done at your convenience and this job is a great opportunity to get your school age children involved in a worthy project for their school. St. Dominic PTO benefits from the profits of the recycling when All-Weather insulation pays us 3 cents per pound for the papers. This recycling project has generated many thousands of dollars for our school over the years. Thank you again, Tom, for all your hard work in keeping the trailer so beautifully organized! ## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The liturgy seems reluctant to return to Ordinary Time from the joys of Easter, and so the festivities extend to today's celebration of the mystery of God's relationship to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Gospel today centers the question of our relationship with God in the struggle of Nathaniel to believe that it is possible to experience "rebirth" in the Spirit. The answer of Jesus is that God's response to the messes of this world is the mystery of saving love in Jesus Christ and the outpouring of an empowering Spirit.

Western church architecture often tops a church building with a spire, indicating humanity's reach to a transcendent God. The Eastern Church responds with onion-shaped domes, indicating the Spirit's being poured down upon humanity precisely at this locale, the gathering of the faithful for the Divine Liturgy. This familiar design encodes a great mystery: here, at the Lord's Table, we experience the outpouring of the Spirit for the life of the world. Nathaniel came to Jesus by night, since he was still working out the meaning of his life. A life attuned to the inner life of the Trinity must always be given to the light of day.
