**Parish Bookkeeper:** St. Dominic Church in Springfield is seeking a Parish Bookkeeper. This position is full-time (30 hours per week). We are a medium size parish with approximately 500 families; a school and pre-school with 225 students; multiple school and parish related organizations, and a school cafeteria. The bookkeeper reports to the pastor and performs all financial bookkeeping and accounting functions, in accordance with archdiocesan financial standards. Familiarity with PDS Ledger, Paycor, Excel, Word and Outlook Express is strongly desired. Candidate must have 3 to 5 years of experience in bookkeeping/accounting, possess excellent organizational skills, maintain confidentiality about parishioners, volunteers and staff, and be an active Catholic. **Youth Group:** All students in grades 9-12 are invited and encouraged to participate in St. Dominic Youth Group, which meets the second Wednesday of the month from 7:00 p.m. – 8:15 p.m. in the church basement (Sept. – May). Our first meeting will take place on Wednesday, September 11, 2019. Dues of \$25 per member will be collected at the first meeting, and activities for the year will be discussed.

**School News:** No school Monday (Labor Day). Beginning September 6, there will be no Friday afternoon bus transportation through the end of April.

**Parish Council:** Saint Dominic is forming a new parish council. The Parish Council is an advisory committee to the Pastor. It touches all aspects of parish life: Worship, Service, Faith Formation and Administration. An effective parish council includes people with a variety of expertise. For example: building and grounds maintenance, education, technology, social media, advertising, music, scripture, theology, etc. (Finance and Legal experts better serve the Finance Council). An effective parish council also includes people who are valued specifically for their perspective, for example: Young Adults, School Parents, Long-time Parishioners, and New Parishioners. But above and beyond lending expertise or perspective to the pastor, the most important qualities are to be *trustworthy, common-sense* folks who care about *every* parishioner's faith and salvation. Our community is rich in these qualities. As your pastor, I ask each parishioner to do the following: (1) Look around the pews on Sunday. Who is someone you trust who will serve our entire parish well? (2) Pray to God, "Thy Will Be Done." (3) Ask that person to nominate themselves for Parish Council by placing their name in the tin box (on the table in the back of church) **by September 8th**. Ten nominees will be drawn at random to serve on the council. Five members will serve a two-year term and five members will serve a three-year term. The parish council meets on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of the month, 6:30-7:30 p.m., except June, July, August & December. **The first meeting will be held on October 15th.** Thank you to everyone for your prayers and input!
